# **SEALS**

### REPORTING LIVE SEAL STRANDINGS:

### ARE YOU SURE THE SEAL IS IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE?:

Seals regularly haul out on land. Pups are often left alone while their mother is looking for food.

When there is a live seal pup on the shoreline, observe it from a distance, look for signs of a cough or injury. If it is in a safe place and showing no obvious ill effects leave it alone and check again in 24 hours.

### WHAT TO DO IF A SEAL IS IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE:

If you are unsure whether it is safe or if the animal is unwell or injured, call:

# HELPFUL INFORMATION TO COLLECT

## **Photos**

Pictures are really important as they provide definite identification. If possible please take photos of:

- 1 full length
- 1 head shot including teeth
- 1 of the genitalia region (to sex the animal)
- Any unusual marks



# Length of the animal

If you can't go back to measure it, please just provide an estimation.

# Location

- Name of beach
- Name of County
- Grid reference



# **Description** (If you are unable to provide a photo)

- Description of the animals head, beak, swollen forehead.
- Did it have teeth or baleen?
- Were the teeth needle or spade shaped?
- Colour of the skin, including any white patches or stripes.
- The state of decomposition fresh, moderately decomposed or very decomposed.

WARNING: Marine animals are wild animals. They may carry diseases which are transferable to humans. Do not put yourself at risk of injury. Do not attempt to move heavy animals without adequate assistance. Always wash hands thoroughly after any contact.
